#### AUS GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES DEFINED

AUS has identified sixteen perspectives for global citizenship. These perspectives will lay the foundation for implementation for global citizenship in the curriculum. Below are the Global Perspectives and their definitions.

**Location:** Where people live matters.

**Movement/Migration:** Moving to new places changes the people, land, and culture of the new place, as well as the place that was left.

**Productions, Distribution, Consumption:** The ways people make, get, and use goods and services may be different from how people in other places make, get, and use goods and services.

**Rule of Law:** Laws are made to keep people safe and explain what the government can and cannot do.

**Technological Innovation:** New technology has many types of different consequences, depending on how people use that technology.

**Human Environmental Interaction:** Humans, their society, and the environment affect each other.

**Conflict and Change:** When there is conflict between or with societies, change is the result.

**Governance:** As a society increase in complexity and interacts with other societies, the complexity of the government also increases.

**Gain from Trade:** Parties trade voluntarily when they expect gain.

## Global Citizenship

During the 2016-17 school year, the AUS Steering Committee worked to construct a definition of Global Citizenship, and to align that definition to the AUS Vision and Mission Statements. 2017-2018

2018-2019

- AUS will complete two Global Citizenship Impact projects per grade-level.
